Report on the work completed by JSC 'O'zavtosanoat' in 2022

In 2022, the volume of industrial production by the enterprises of JSC "O'zavtosanoat" amounted to 49,834.3 billion soums, compared to the projected figure of 46,253.7 billion soums, achieving 107.7% of the plan. The growth rate compared to the same period last year reached 144.4%.

By main product categories:

At JSC "O'zAvto Motors," the production plan for passenger cars was set at 325,000 units, while actual production amounted to 327,639 units, achieving 100.8% of the plan (growth rate compared to the same period last year – 139.0%).

Similarly, the production of ISUZU brand trucks and buses reached 4,192 units against a planned 4,165 units (100.6% of the plan, growth rate – 98.6%). The production of MAN and Sinotruck brand trucks and buses amounted to 574 units against a plan of 573 units (100.2% of the plan, growth rate – 153.1%). The production of KamAZ brand trucks amounted to 685 units against a plan of 606 units (113.0% of the plan, growth rate – 84.8%). The production of light commercial vehicles totaled 457 units against a plan of 423 units (108.0% of the plan).

In 2022, product exports to foreign countries totaled \$553.8 million (growth rate – 136.1%).

During the reporting period, investments totaling \$199.3 million were utilized under five projects, achieving 126.5% of the planned target.

Additionally, on July 18, 2022, the production of Chevrolet Tracker cars began at the JSC "UzAuto Motors" plant in the city of Asaka.

At the JSC "UzAuto Motors Powertrain" plant, in accordance with the plan, the serial production of L4H AT and LIF MT engines began on the "CSS Prime" assembly line on December 1, 2022. On December 22, the official ceremony for the launch of CSS Prime engine serial production took place.

Under the localization program, 37 projects resulted in the production of goods worth 5,676.2 billion soums. To increase the level of localization, the enterprises mastered the production of 1,023 types of imported parts.

In 2022, the industry enterprises created 4,186 new jobs.
